## The City of Brighton

## Sussex University


- On the outskirts of Brighton.

# Gravitational Waves and LTA's

- PhD topic:
   Gravitational waves from a first-order phase transition in the early Universe.
- Lots of important work in the field from researchers at HIP!
- Long Term Attachments:
- Funded by Research Councils in UK.
- Study at another institute/university.
- Originally designed for experimental particle physicists to visit experiments.



# Qualifying and Courses

- Typical route in UK
- 4 year undergraduate masters
  (MPhys/MSci) into PhD.
- Study additional 2-3 modules (15-22.5 ECTS) during PhD.
- Modules seem less flexible/specialized compared to Helsinki.

## Financing PhDs: Students or Employees?

- In UK most home students funded by Research Councils such as STFC, EPSRC...
- Students funded by Research Councils typically get stipend around €16,000.
  - Stipend is a grant so tax-free!
- UK students aren't employees:
  - Tuition fees (normally waived for funded PhDs).
  - No pension scheme.
  - No employee benefits.
- •PhD students in UK get full student benefits:
- Don't have to pay "council tax".
- Discount on transport etc.

#### PhD defense

- No 3 paper rule in UK.
- Vivas in the UK:
  - Private defense behind closed doors.
  - Can last many hours.
  - Minor or even major corrections to the thesis common.
  - Failure uncommon but can happen!
- No equivalent of Karonkka!

### Athena Swan

- Established in 2005 to promote gender equality in STEMM employment in higher education and research.
- Based in UK + Republic of Ireland with 159 members.
- Charter of 10 principles <a href="https://tinyurl.com/ASCharter">https://tinyurl.com/ASCharter</a>
- Three levels of award:
  - Bronze analyse data to identify gender gaps/leaks, create an action plan for three years.
  - Silver evidence of impact/achievement based on action plan.
     Ambitious plans for further actions/achievement.
  - Gold evidence of considerable action and impact. Support to other institutions to further principles of Athena Swan.
- Sussex holds silver award.
