

Grants can be awarded to Ukrainian citizens in Finland or Finnish researchers for inviting Ukrainian citizens to carry out research work in Finland. The taxfree grants can be used for travel costs and costs for living up to 2040 € per month. The applications including a research plan, a schedule, the researchers CV and a budget, should be sent to <societas@scientiarum.fi>. The applications are handled in the order they are submitted.

The grants can be applied for as long as the war continues. The board of the Society will later decide about when this grant program will end.

LERU Doctoral Summer School, 3-8 July 2022, Utrecht University

The University of the Future, Rethinking the role of universities worldwide in the face of the challenges of the 21st century.

The 12th LERU Doctoral Summer School will be held at the Utrecht University from 3 July until 8 July 2022.

What is the LERU Doctoral Summer School?

The University of Helsinki is a member of the League of European Research Universities (LERU), an association of 23 leading research-intensive universities that share the values of high-quality teaching within an environment of internationally competitive research. Each year, LERU organizes a Doctoral Summer School on a specific topic. All member universities of LERU are invited to send one doctoral candidate to participate in the meeting.

Theme and objectives of the 2022 LERU Doctoral Summer School

The theme of the 2022 LERU Doctoral Summer School is "The University of the Future, Rethinking the role of universities worldwide in the face of the challenges of the 21st century."

A group of selected PhD students from LERU members and a number of UU partner universities will get together for a week to listen to inspiring speakers and to work on a Manifest. The formula of this Summer School is such that relatively much time is reserved for participants to deliberate and brainstorm, to write their appeal in stages throughout the week.

Who can apply?

Doctoral candidates from all disciplines are encouraged to apply. Candidates should be in an advanced stage of the doctoral program and be highly motivated to work intensively on this project in an international and interdisciplinary team. The participants should be available for the entire duration of the summer school and participate in all events. The days will be full and long. Candidates must be very motivated to work on the topic of the summer school and prepared to participate in all activities in the programme. All lectures, hands-on events and discussions will be in English, so proficiency in English is a prerequisite.

Selection process

Each LERU university conducts its own selection procedure and provides a list of ranked candidates to LERU Office. The first-ranked candidate from each university is automatically accepted. Second places (and any further places, based on availability) are decided by the local organisers after consideration of all applications, aiming to achieve a balanced representation with regard to disciplines, gender and university affiliation with due consideration of rank order and merit.

Participation fee

The summer course will be delivered on-site. Should that not be possible, the event will be moved to an entirely online format.

The participation fee (including accommodation) and travel expenses (Economy) of the selected participants from the University of Helsinki are covered by the Doctoral Schools.

Please submit your application by 27 March by filling in the electronic form and include your cv as an attachment.

The University of Helsinki candidates will be selected and sent out for consideration by the LERU Office by 31 March 2022.

to contribute to the project Just sustainabilities: Defining Due Diligence for the Rights of Indigenous peoples, led by Assistant Professor Dorothée Cambou. Focusing on the impacts of wind energy projects in Finland and Sweden, the project aims to define the role of the law to ensure corporate respect for the rights of indigenous peoples and promote a just transition. For this purpose, this research project makes a socio-legal analysis about the state of the law in the Nordic countries and its influence to regulate corporate Human Rights Due Diligence in relation with the rights of indigenous peoples. Socio-legal methods with qualitative research best characterize the approach of the project. We highly encourage applicants with linkages to these themes and an interest in business and human rights to apply.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Applicants must hold a doctoral degree in a field that is relevant to the research topic and have a high-quality research proposal. Moreover, he or she is expected to have the ability to conduct independent scientific research and possess the teaching skills required for the position. The aim of the position is to encourage the appointee to further their skills and gain more experience to prepare them for an academic career.

An appointee must be able to provide a clear contribution to the theme of the Project. To fulfil the research requirements of the position, the applicant chosen is awaited to reside in Finland while employed by the University of Helsinki, and actively to participate in the research and teaching activities of the Project and the Faculty.

Sosiologisen demokratiatutkimuksen keskus (Centre for Sociology of Democracy, CSD) hakee tutkijatohtoria tai viimeistelyvaiheessa oleva väitöskirjatutkijaa Demokratiatekijät-hankkeen tutkijakoordinaattoriksi. CSD on tutkijayhteisö, joka edistää tieteellistä tutkimusta ja sosiologista ymmärrystä demokratian ulottuvuuksista ja käytännön tasoista. CSD:n hankkeissa tehtävä tutkimus on sekä kansainvälisesti merkittävää että suomalaisen yhteiskunnan kanssa keskustelevaa ja sen

tiedontarpeisiin pureutuvaa. CSD toimii Helsingin yliopistossa sosiologian tieteenalalla ja sitä johtavat professorit Eeva Luhtakallio ja Veikko Eranti.

Demokratiatekijät-hanke tähtää CSD:n nostamiseen demokratiatutkimuksen kansainväliselle huipulle ja kotimaassa tunnetuksi, pysyväksi ja kasvavaksi demokratia-asiantuntemuksen alustaksi. Hankkeessa tiivistetään CSD:n tutkijoiden ja tutkimusprojektien välistä yhteistyötä ja tuotetaan täysin uusia, yhteisölle yhteisiä tutkimuksen ja tutkimusviestinnän muotoja. Demokratiatekijöissä tieteellinen kompetenssi ja monitieteinen kansainvälinen verkottuneisuus yhdistyvät monialaiseen viestintäosaamiseen ja yhteiskunnallisiin verkostoihin, jotka yltävät niin päätöksenteon, hallinnon, kansalaisaktivismin, taiteen, nuorten toimijoiden kuin eri tavoin marginalisoitujen ihmisten pariin.

Haemme joukkoomme akateemisen maailman tuntevaa tutkija-koordinaattoria, joka tekee CSD:n teemoihin liittyvää tutkimusta sekä suunnittelee, tukee ja seuraa CSD:n strategiatyötä tiiviissä yhteistyössä CSD:n tutkijoiden kanssa. Tutkija-koordinaattorin vastuualueena ovat erityisesti Demokratiatekijät-hankkeen osa-alueet, joihin kuuluu muun muassa tiedeviestinnän suunnittelu ja toteutus, sidosryhmäviestintä, tapahtumien suunnittelu, CSD:n alaisten tutkimushankkeiden välisen yhteistyön kehittäminen, hankevalmistelun tuki, sisäiset koulutukset, verkostoyhteistyö sekä johtoryhmätyöskentely.

VALINTAKRITEERIT

Tutkijatohtorin tehtävään valittavalta edellytetään soveltuvaa tohtorin tutkintoa. Viimeistelyvaiheessa olevalla väitöskirjantekijälla on oltava jatko-opinto-oikeus HY:ssä ja hänen väitöstutkimuksensa on sovittava aiheeltaan CSD:n teemoihin.

Odotamme tutkija-koordinaattorilta näkemyksellistä ja itsenäistä otetta tutkimusyhteisön toiminnan kehittämiseen ja uusien toimintojen luomiseen ja toteutukseen. Poliittisen sosiologian kentän tuntemus katsotaan eduksi, minkä lisäksi toivomme, että tutkija-koordinaattorin oma tutkimus tai tutkimuksellinen kiinnostus liittyy CSD:n teemoihin. Työkielemme ovat suomi ja englanti.

TARJOAMME

Tarjoamme innostuneen ja innostavan työyhteisön, jonka toiminta perustuu yhdessä tekemiseen ja avuliaisuuteen ja jolla on monipuoliset kansalliset ja kansainväliset yhteistyöverkostot sekä laaja asiantuntemus niin poliittisesta sosiologiasta, tutkimusmenetelmistä ja niiden yhdistelystä kuin rahoitushakujen ja julkaisemisen käytännön kysymyksistä. Hankkeeseen rekrytoidaan myös tutkimusavustaja tukemaan tutkija-koordinaattorin työtä.
