The lectures will deal with selected problems of modern international law. Among the topics are: Customary Process in International Law (Degan), Current Problems in the Law of International Claims (Lillich), Maritime and Territorial Boundary Disputes (Sinclair), Human Rights in Europe (Sundberg), Outer Space (Andem), The United Nations (Broms), European Institutional Law (Joutsamo) and The Concept of State (Rosas).

The lectures and seminars are given in English. The Summer Seminar will be held at the University of Helsinki. During the Summer Seminar it is possible to obtain two different kinds of Certificates: i) Certificate of Active Attendance and ii) Certificate of Successful Examination on International Law (The Seminar Diploma).

The Seminar consists of courses and seminars. Diploma candidates are also obliged to participate in the Seminar Examination.

ADMISSION

There are no course or registration charges. However, to obtain admission to the courses, one has to register by filling in a registration form or by sending the application of attendance preferably before July 31, 1988.

ACCOMODATION

Participants are free to make their own arrangemens for accommodation. A limited number of rooms has been reserved from the Helsinki Summer Hotels. The rooms can be reserved through the Secretariat of the Summer Seminar. The reservations will be accepted on a continuing basis. The cost for accommodation in double rooms including breakfast will be 110 FIM a day. Private accommodation may also be arranged for some participants. Reasonably priced meals are available at the University restaurants.

RECREATION

There will be also excursions and receptions. Time for recreation and entertaiment will be reserved in the course program. The City of Helsinki, the capital of Finland, is situated at the coastline of the most unique and beautiful archipelagoarea. The Secretariat gives detailed information to the participants of recreational facilities.
