The Eighth Helsinki Summer Seminar on International Law will be held on 21st August - 1st September 1995 with the general title "New Approaches to International Law". The series of lectures will explore the links between international law and international politics and focus on recent developments in the theory of international law. Special attention will be given to interdisciplinary approaches, interpretation, feminism and international law and developments in human rights. Lecturers will include leading international and Finnish scholars who have participated in the so-called "New Approaches"-project, and others with an interest in unconventional perspectives.

## **PROGRAM**

The lectures and seminars are given in English. The Summer Seminar will be held at the Porthania Building of the University of Helsinki (Hallituskatu 11-13, FIN-00014 The University of Helsinki). During the Summer Seminar it is possible to obtain two different kinds of Certificates: 1) Certificate of Active Attendance and 2) Certificate of Successful Examination on International Law (The Seminar Diploma). The Seminar consists of courses and Seminars. Diploma candidates are also obliged to participate in the Seminar Examination.

## **ADMISSION**

To obtain admission to the courses, one has to register by filling in a registration form or by sending the application of attendance preferably before August 1, 1995. There is a registration and tuition fee of 500 FIM which should be paid in advance at the time of registration.
