#### Information interview- gain insight and build a network



Find a person with an interesting job and suggest a lunch meeting or coffee / a teams call etc. Use your UNITalent contacts



The aim of the meeting is to find out about the job or organization



What duties do you have? What is your typical working week like? What skills do you need?



In which networks are you active?



You can also ask about challenges as well as the competence and development needs the organiszation will be facing in the future.



At the same time, talk about yourself. What is your story?

#### The elevator pitch

An elevator pitch is a brief (think 30 seconds!) way of introducing yourself, getting across a key point or two, and making a connection with someone. It's called an elevator pitch because it takes roughly the amount of time, you'd spend riding an elevator with someone.

- Who are you?
- · What are you interested in?
- What is your connection to the other party / organization?
- · Be clear, make it simple!
- Prepare
