Welcome

Welcome to University of Helsinki!

I warmly welcome you to the University of Helsinki. While we are proud of our almost 400 years heritage, we aim to be at the forefront of educational technology developments. During my career, I have seen and participated in this development firsthand. In the 1990's lecture materials started to be shared on web pages, back then a new revolutionary technology. While this was already a marked improvement compared to the endless copying of lecture notes that was standard in the 1980's, it did not allow for organized interaction with the students. Moodle raised the online teaching environments to a new level, and was rapidly and widely taken into use at our university in the 2000's. While Moodle was never strictly enforced to be used at every course, thanks to good features and guidance it become so widely used that students expect a Moodle page to exist for every course – if a course does not have one, students complain the course does not exist!

Now the teaching technologies are developing to new levels – videos and videoconferencing have been common since the 2010's, and now in the 2020's virtual reality and generative artificial intelligence have been introduced to the mix. Our university is now embracing also these new technologies – and not only separately, but also in concurrent combination. I am happy to see in your programme that you are exploring how the Moodle environment can be enhanced with these newest developments.

I wish you a very fruitful meeting and that you also get to enjoy the magical feeling of the Nordic white nights!




Venue

The venue is University of Helsinki's historical and recently renovated main building in the downtown Helsinki.

Address: Fabianinkatu 33, Helsinki

The venue is located 10 minute walk from the central railway station for train, metro, tram, and buses. The University of Helsinki metro station is 200 metres from the venue and there are tram stops located right next to the building.





Practical information

Info and registration desk: located on the ground floor of the main building. Info and registration open: Mon 8:30-17, Tue 9-16:30

From the info and registration desk you can collect your MoodleMoot pass as well as complementary drink tickets for the MoodleMoot party.

During the event in case of needing assistance you can contact the info desk or people wearing orange lanyards and pink Ask Me! -pins.

For safety reasons, the conference pass must be worn at all time during the event.

Luggage and coatroom: Coats and other personal belongings can be stored in lockers on the ground floor of the venue. There is no separate cloakroom for conference attendees. Ask the staff for assistance if needed. Remember to empty the locker upon leaving the venue. The university of Helsinki or MoodleMoot Finland is not responsible for lost items.

Larger luggage cannot be stored at the venue. The central railway station has luggage lockers that can store bigger luggage.

Food and beverages: Lunch, morning and afternoon coffee and evening party included for all participants. Vegan option is always available.

Certificates and feedback: After the MoodleMoot certificates and a feedback survey will be sent to the participants.



WiFi: There are two free wireless networks available, Eduroam and HelsinkiUni Guest visitor networks.

If you have an eduroam user account at your home university you can use the same account in the eduroam network at the University of Helsinki.



1st floor





Accessibility

We strive to make MoodleMoot as accessible as possible. Please let us know if we can assist you in some way. Sometimes step-free access, accessible service or just the right piece of information may require some collaboration. In brief, step-free access should be available to all the rooms and services within the conference venue. Some rooms, like the Small hall have a platform stair lift. Moreover, there are two elevators large enough for powerchairs and similar larger mobility aids (width 95 cm and length 130 cm or 38" and 52"). One elevator is right next to the lobby on Fabianinkatu side and provides access to the rooms starting with the letter "F". Please enter the conference venue using the entrance on Fabianinkatu. It is step-free and right next to most services.
