



Robert Putnam well-functioning social networks have a positive effect on the prosperity of the society as a whole

If weak, social cohesion is lost and it is difficult for members of society to reach common goals




RECIPROCITY -NON-RECIPROCITY

-Anger or rage -Punishment feelings and obligations, requiring responses in kind,


Positive for positive & negative for negative



Reciprocity

Connected to the power in relationships and the responsibilities each individual will undertake

- Not only a reflection of the personal parameters
- May reflect the effects the surrounding community and society have on people's relationships






