Programme Objective	The objective of the programme is to give an overview of the Finnish educational system and of the education of English language in primary, secondary and upper secondary schools.  Teaching will be carried out as lectures, discussions and workshops.  The study programme consists of approximately 2.5 days of presentations and visits, and (approx.) 5.5 days of in-service training.  Each full day consists of six or seven academic hours (one hour is 45 minutes). The programme length is 50 academic hours.  The visitors will be escorted by a Palmenia staff member.
