This project brings together planning theorists, urban planners, and scholars in philosophical aesthetics to explore the role of aesthetic values and aesthetic experience both in planning processes and in experiences of urban dwellers. The project develops conceptual tools to understand better the nature of aesthetic values and aesthetic experience theoretically and in practice. The project, to be implemented over the course of 4 years, will focus on the metropolitan area of Helsinki, as well as Lahti.

Hanke tuo yhteen suunnittelun teoreettikoita, kaupunkisuunnittelijoita ja filosofisen estetiikan asiantuntijoita tutkimaan esteettisten arvojen ja esteettisen kokemisen asemaa sekä suunnitteluprosesseissa että kaupunkilaisten kokemusmaailmassa. Projektin kehittää käsiteellisiä välineitä esteettisten arvojen ja kokemusten merkityksen ymärtämiseksi niin teoreettisesti kuin käytännön tasolla. Tutkimushanke on mitoittettu nelivuotiseksi, ja sen puitteissa tarkastellaan urbaanin ympäristön kysymyksiä pääkaupunkiseudulla ja Lahdessa.
